**COMMUNITY KITCHEN AT ST. PAUL** St. Paul is launching a new cooking series that seeks to bring together people from all walks of life and teach time-honored skills like canning, food preservation, baking and more. Organized by writer and food blogger (and St. Paul member), Rachel Quartarone, the first class will be offered on Sunday, October 23. Classes are geared toward adults, though youth ages 12 and up are invited to attend with a parent or designated "grown-up." This hands-on class will be limited to 10 participants. #### **Everything Apple**

**October 23, 2011 -- 2:30-5 p.m.**

It's apple season in Georgia. Using apples fresh from Mercier Orchard in Blue Ridge, we'll learn how to make and preserve homemade applesauce, apple butter and apple jelly. Many hands make light work as we peel apples, share stories and learn about time honored apple preserving methods. At the end of the class, you'll take home recipes and samples of what we make. This class is taught by Niki Fox, a local food blogger ([www.lifeinrecipes.com](http://www.lifeinrecipes.com)) and lover of food preservation. Niki has made and documented countless batches of jelly and jams in her lifetime and has learned what works – and what doesn't. She is happy to share her knowledge and recipes.
